

Hip Joint Injection

If you're living with persistent hip pain or stiffness that hasn't improved with rest, physiotherapy, or medication, a targeted hip joint injection may offer effective relief. What Is A Hip Joint Injection?

A hip joint injection is a procedure where medication is injected directly into the hip joint to relieve pain and inflammation. It is often used to diagnose the cause of hip pain as well as to treat it. These injections can provide rapid relief from symptoms caused by arthritis, bursitis, or other inflammatory conditions affecting the hip.

Hip injections are performed under ultrasound or X-ray guidance to ensure precision and safety. The injection typically includes a combination of a local anaesthetic and an anti-inflammatory medication such as a corticosteroid.

When Might You Benefit From A Hip Injection?

Hip joint injections may be recommended if you have:

- Osteoarthritis of the hip
- Inflammatory arthritis (e.g. rheumatoid arthritis)
- Hip impingement or labral tear
- Bursitis or synovitis
- Persistent hip pain that limits your mobility

These injections can be used as a standalone treatment or as part of a wider care plan alongside physiotherapy or other non-surgical approaches.

What Types Of Injections Are Available?

At Midlands Orthopaedic Clinic, we offer several types of hip joint injections tailored to your condition and treatment goals:

- Corticosteroid injections: Help reduce inflammation and relieve pain for weeks or months
- Hyaluronic acid injections: Often called "gel injections," these lubricate the joint to ease movement and reduce pain
- Platelet-rich plasma (PRP) injections: Use your own blood components to stimulate natural



healing in the joint

 nStride injections: A newer biological treatment that targets inflammation and promotes joint health without medication

Your consultant will help you decide which type of injection is most suitable based on your symptoms and medical history.

What Happens During The Procedure?

Hip injections are usually performed as an outpatient procedure and take around 15 to 30 minutes. You will lie on your back while the area around your hip is cleaned and numbed with a local anaesthetic.

Using real-time imaging guidance, your consultant will insert a fine needle into the hip joint and deliver the chosen medication. The procedure is quick and usually well tolerated.

Afterwards, you may be asked to rest for a short period and avoid high-impact activities for a couple of days. Most people are able to go home the same day and resume light activities within 24 hours.
